

1.1 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1.1 Introduction

This report arises from the vetting exercise that was conducted by the Committee on Appointments on the nominee to the position of County Executive Committee Member in the portfolio of Lands, Water, Irrigation, Physical Planning, Housing, Urban Development, Environment and Natural Resources on 1st March 2021.

The notification for nomination of Mrs. Mugambi Jayne Ndegi, proposed for the position of County ExecutiveCommittee Member of this portfolio was forwarded by his H. E. the Governor through a letter which included the nominees academic and professional testimonialsdated15th February 2021 and Ref:No. EBU/C.GVT/GVN/CAE/VOL.2/003(Annexure I)

The notification of the nomination was tabled in the County Assembly on 18th February 2021 and subsequently committed to the Committee on Appointments for vetting and subsequent reporting to the County assembly for a resolution.

The County Assembly in compliance with Section 8(3) of the Embu County Public Appointment (County Assembly Approval) Act, 2015, notified the candidate and members of the public of the time and place of holding the approval hearings vide an advertisement in the Standard Newspaper on Sunday 21stFebruary 2021.(Annexure II)

Pursuant to Sections 8 and 9 of Embu County Public Appointments (County Assembly Approval) Act, 2015 and the various provisions of the Embu County Assembly Standing Orders, the Committee successfully conducted the vetting exercise publicly on 1stMarch 2021 in the Embu County Assembly Board room.

The Committee, however, regretted that no member of the public appeared during the vetting exercise and no memorandum was received.

It was noted that the nominee had the requisite qualifications as confirmed by her testimonials and experience. The nominee also understood the position into which she had been nominated and was

willing to work for the prescribed remuneration. The Committee observed that the nominee indicated she would be available to perform the duties of the CECM always during her service in office.

Upon completion of the exercise, and after a thorough interrogation of the submitted documents, the Committee recommended that Mrs Mugambi Jayne Ndegi be appointed to the position of the CECM Lands, Water, Irrigation, Physical Planning, Housing, Urban Development, Environment and Natural resources.

1.1.2 Mandate of the Committee

The Committee on Appointments was formed pursuant to Standing Order Number 198 (4) of the County Assembly of Embu Standing Orders which provides that, the committee shall consider, for approval by the County Assembly, Appointments under Article 179(2)(b) of the Constitution (Members of County Executive Committee). The present committee was formed by a resolution of the Assembly passed on the 13th September 2017. This is also provided for under Section 14(3) of the County Governments Act 2012 (Revised)

1.1.3 Membership of the Committee

1.2 PROBLEM STATEMENT

This report is compiled in fulfillment of therequirements of the provision of Section 35of the County Governments Act,2012 as read together with Section 8of the Embu Public Appointments (County Assembly Approval Act),2015 which gives guidelines on the nomination and approval of nominee to the Embu County Executive Committee.

H.E the Governor, forwardedthe message on the appointment of the nominee to the position of County Executive Committee Member ,Lands ,Water,Irrigation Physical Planning,Housing,Urban Development,Environment and Natural Resources which was tabled in the Assembly on 18thFebruary 2021and subsequently committed to the committee on Appointments.

The committee was therefore required to consider the matter and table a report within fourteen days as outlined in the Embu County Public Appointment (County Assembly Approval)Act ,2015 section 10

1.3 OBJECTIVES

- 1. Toconsider and vet the nominee for suitability to the position of the County Executive Committee Member for the portfolio of Lands, Water, Irrigation, Physical Planning, Housing, Urban Development, Environment and Natural Resource.
- 2. To prepare and table a report on the nominee before the County Assembly of Embu for consideration and approval.

1.4 METHODOLOGY

The Committee on Appointments applied the following methods to come up with this report:

- 1. Committee meetings
- 2. Conducting vetting exercise publicly in the County Assembly Boardroom
- 3. Perusing and analyzing testimonials and other documents
- 4. The Committee also made reference to the relevant statutes and rules of procedure to ensure compliance by the nominee.

2.0 LEGAL FRAMEWORK

2.1 Constitution of Kenya 2010

The Constitution of Kenya sets out certain requirements with regards to appointments to Public office which include;

(i) Leadership and Integrity

The Committee in consideration of the nominee took into consideration the provisions of Chapter Six of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 and in particular Articles;

- I. Article 73 (2) the guiding principles of leadership and integrity include:
 - a) selection on the basis of personal integrity, competence and suitability, or election in free and fair elections;
 - objectivity and impartiality in decision making, and in ensuring that decisions are not influenced by nepotism, favoritism, other improper motives or corrupt practices;
 - c) selfless service based solely on the public interest, demonstrated by
 - i. honesty in the execution of public duties; and
 - ii. the declaration of any personal interest that may conflict with public duties;
 - d) accountability to the public for decisions and actions; and
 - e) discipline and commitment in service to the people
- II Article75(1) of the Constitution requires a State Officer, whether in public or Private life to behave in a manner that avoids conflict between personal interest and public official duties and Article 75(3) of the Constitution that prohibits a State Officer who has been removed from office under that Article from holding any other State Office.
- III Article 77(2) of the Constitution prohibits an appointed State officer from holding Office in a political party
- IV Article 78 of the Constitution disqualifies persons who are not Kenyan Citizens and persons holding dual citizenship from appointment as State Officers.

(ii) Composition of The County Executive Committee

Article 179(2) of the Constitution provides that;

The County Executive Committee consists of:-

- a) The County Governor and the Deputy County Governor; and
- b) Members appointed by the County Governor with the approval of the Assembly, from among persons who are not members of the Assembly.

(iii) Public Participation

Article 196(1) and (2) of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 provides Public participation and County Assembly powers, privileges and immunities

- 1. A County Assembly shall:-
 - a) conduct its business in an open manner, and hold its sittings and those of itscommittees, in public; and
 - b) facilitate public participation and involvement in the legislative and other business of the assembly and its committees.
- A County assembly may not exclude the public, or any media, from any sitting unless in exceptional circumstances the speaker has determined that there are justifiable reasons for doing so.

2.2 The County Governments Act, 2012

Section 35 of the County Governments Act provides the criteria to be considered by the Governor in nominating members for the County Executive Committee as well as the issues that the County Assembly needs to take into consideration when considering nominations i.e.

35(2) The county assembly shall not approve nominations for appointment to the executive committee that do not take into account:-

- a) not more than two thirds of either gender;
- b) representation of the minorities, marginalized groups and
- c) communities; and Community and cultural diversity within the county.
- (3) A person may be appointed as a member of the county Executive Committee if that person:Page 11 of 20

- a) is a Kenyan citizen;
- b) is a holder of at least a first degree from a university recognised in Kenya;
- c) satisfies the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution; and
- d) has knowledge, experience and a distinguished career of not less than five years in the field relevant to the portfolio of the department to which the person is being appointed.
- (4) A member of the County Executive Committee shall not hold any other State or public office

2.3. Embu County Public Participation Act, 2015

Section 19 provides Public participation and County Assembly powers, privileges and immunities

(1) A County Assembly shall—

- (a) conduct its business in an open manner, and hold its sittings and those of its committees, in public; and
- (b) facilitate public participation and involvement in the legislative and otherbusiness of the assembly and its committees.
- (2) A County Assembly may not exclude the public, or any media, from any sitting unless in exceptional circumstances the speaker has determined that there are justifiable reasons for doing so.

2.4 The Embu County Public Appointments (County Assembly Approval) Act, 2015 The procedures for public appointments are set out under the abovementioned Act and specifically as follows;

Section 9 of the Embu County Public Appointments (County Assembly Approval) Act, 2015 provides that the issues for consideration by the relevant House in relation to any nomination shall be:

- i. The procedure used to arrive at the nominee.
- ii. Any constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question; and

iii. The suitability of the nominee for appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominee's abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the field to which nomination is being made.

Prior to the vetting, notification to the Public must be done. Section 8(3)(a) of the Embu County Public Appointments (County Assembly Approval) Act, 2015 provides that the Committee shall, by notice in at least one newspaper of national circulation, notify the public of the time and place for holding an approval hearing at least sevendays prior to the hearing.

Further, Section 8(9) of the same Act provides that, any person may, prior to theapproval hearing, and by written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which thecandidate has been nominated.

It's of importance to note that the, the Clerk placed an advertisement in Standard Newspaper informing members of the public and the nominee of the date of the hearing, and inviting the public to submit to the office of the Clerk in writing and under oath any relevant information concerning the nominees opposing their suitability to the respective offices in conformity with Section 8(9) of the Embu Public Appointments (County Assembly Approval) Act, 2015.

Section 8(10) of the Embu County Public Appointments (County Assembly Approval Act) 2015 provides that a candidate may, at any time, by notice in writing addressed to the Clerk, withdraw from the approval process and the candidate's nomination shall thereupon lapse

Unless otherwise provided in any law, a committee shall consider a nomination and table its report in the County Assembly for debate and decision within 14 days from the date on which the notification of the nominee was given under section 7 of Embu county public Appointments(county Assembly Approval Act)2015.

3.0 COMMITTEE DELIBERATIONS

The Committee, in the course of discharging its mandate conducted the vetting process, examined the nominee against the vetting criteria in accordance with the EmbuCounty Public Appointments (County Assembly Approval) Act 2015, Section (5). The Committee particularly checked on the following matters;

- (i) Academic credentials
- (ii) Professional training
- (iii) Experience
- (iv) Personal integrity
- (v) Background
- (vi) Compliance with statutory obligation (EACC clearance, HELB, Certificate of Good conduct, CRB and Tax compliance)

The Nominee, Mrs.Mugambi Jayne Ndegi made her presentation under oath after which she took the committee through the Vetting questionnaire as the members thoroughly scrutinized her testimonials.(Annexure III)

The nominee while defending her case and answering to the committee member's questions stated that she would;

- 1. Steer policy formulation and implementation on matters pertaining the said portfolio.
- 2. Advise H. E the Governor on matters pertinent to lands portfolio
- 3. Maintain strategic direction to the department

She also stated that, she was willing to work for the prescribed remuneration by the Salaries Remuneration Commission. and that she had demonstrated her ability to serve in that office as she has been undertaking duties pertaining to that office in her position as acting CECM in the past few months(1stDecember 2020 to date)

4.0 COMMITTEE FINDINGS AND OBSERVATIONS

The committee having considered her curriculum vitae and heard her oral submissions during the vetting exercise, made the following observations.

- 1. **THAT** His Excellency the Governor complied with provisions of Section 7 of the Embu County Public Appointment (County Assembly Approval) Act, 2015 on the notification of the nominee to the County Assembly.
- 2. **THAT** no Memorandum was received from the members of the public on the suitability or otherwise of the nominee in question.
- 3. **THAT**, interrogation of Mrs. Mugambi Jayne Ndegi yielded the results as outlined in the table below;
