#### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY.

The Public Participation Committee was formed pursuant to The Embu County Public Participation Act, 2015 which was enacted by the County Assembly on 23<sup>rd</sup> September 2015. Section 20 (1) of the Act provides for the establishment of the Public Participation Committee at the County Assembly.

In the matter under consideration, the Committee was involved in preparation of the Public Participation forums for the Punguza Mizigo (Constitution of Kenya Amendment) Bill, 2019 jointly with the Justice and Legal Affairs Committee. (Annex 1)

The County Assembly of Embu sought the input of members of the public on the proposed Punguza Mizigo (Constitution of Kenya Amendment) Bill, 2019, as presented by the Third Way Alliance Kenya to the County Assembly. The Bill aimed at amending the Constitution of Kenya 2010 in order to reduce the burden and cost of governance.

The Members of the Public Participation Committee and Justice and Legal Affairs Committee were divided into sub committees which spearheaded Public Participation in all the twenty wards in the County. The forums were held starting from Wednesday, 18th September, 2019 up to Tuesday 24th September, 2019. The Members drawn from the two Committees, accompanied by the rest of the Members of the County Assembly held four forums daily, translating to four wards having the exercise per day. The committee noted that the turnout was encouraging unlike in the previous years and that copies of the Bill were dispatched to participants in relatively good time.

This report therefore summarises the issues raised by the members of the public on the organisation and planning of the public forums and the observations made by the Committee regarding the same. The Committee has also made recommendations to improve future forums with reference to the provisions of the law regarding Public Participation forums.

#### 1.1 MANDATE OF THE COMMITTEE

The Committee derives its mandate from Section 20 (4) and Section 21(1) (a) to (k) of the Embu County Public Participation Act, 2015. The Act under Section 20 (4) provides that the Committee shall coordinate public participation in the Assembly.

Section 21(1) Provides that the Assembly Public Participation Committee shall be responsible for--

- (a) Coordinating and moderating Public Participation activities and programs to ensure they are inclusive of the broad spectrum of the public;
- (b) Co-ordinating and promoting co-operation between all participants in Public Participation;
- (c) Ensuring that clear and reasonable timelines are established for Public input and comment and that these timelines are communicated to Public;
- (d) Ensuring that the Public Participation device used is appropriate to the nature of a specific Initiatives, issues involved and the target groups affected;
- (e) Establishing a feedback process to the Public including opportunities for the Public to for Additional comments or input to the decision taken;
- (f) Developing an evaluation framework to the Public Participation plan;
- (g) Providing advice to the Assembly on managing Public Participation process;
- (h) Preparing reports on Public Participation facilitated by Assembly;
- (i) Preparing annual report on Assembly Public Participation processes for consideration by the Assembly
- (J) Developing networks and partnerships with key stakeholders for the purposes of enhancing Public Participation; and
- (k) Carrying out any other function that may be assigned by the Assembly.

#### 1.3 PROBLEM STATEMENT

The proposed Punguza Mizigo (Constitutional Amendment) Bill, 2019 was received in the County Assembly on 19th July, 2019. The Committee got seized of the matter jointly with the Justice and Legal Affairs Committee as per the provisions of the Standing Orders of Embu County Assembly and in conformity with the provisions of Section 21(h) of the Embu County Public Participation Act, 2015.

The Committee is by law required to make a report to the County Assembly on the Public Participation forums held and facilitated by the Assembly. The report seeks to address the concerns raised by the members of the public regarding the public participation forums and it should also prescribe possible solutions to the issues raised.

## 1.4 OBJECTIVES/TERMS OF REFERENCE

- (a) To evaluate how the planning and organization of the Public Participation forums for the Punguza Mizigo (Constitutional Ammendment) Bill, 2019 was executed.
- (b) To scrutinize the views collected from the public matters organization and planning of the forums between 18th and 24th September, 2019 across the 20 wards in Embu County.
- (c) To assess how the forums were executed in the wards.
- (d) To make a report to the County Assembly on how the Public Participation exercise conducted.

#### 1.5 METHODOLOGY

The committee used the following methods in coming up with this report

- 1. Committee meetings
- 2. Actual participation in the public forums
- 3. Observations
- 4. Interviews with participants.
- 5. Interrogation of public participation exit survey questionnaire.

### 2.0 COMMITTEE FINDINGS AND OBSERVATIONS

The Committee held meetings to plan on the modalities of conducting the exercise. The Embu County Public Participation Act, 2015 envisages a situation where after a public participation forum facilitated by the Assembly is held, a report is made and tabled before the Assembly for adoption.

The public participation forums to consider the Punguza Mizigo (Constitutional amendment) Bill, 2019 were held in all the 20 wards and teams spearheading the forums were drawn from two Committees namely, Justice and Legal Affairs and Public Participation committee, pursuant to Standing Orders 196.

Other Honourable Members of the County Assembly joined the sub committees for the exercise.

## 2.1 PLANNING FOR THE PUBLIC PARTICIPATION FORUMS.

The Public Participation Committee held meetings to plan for the forums in consultation with the Justice and Legal Affairs Committee. It was resolved that the two committees would work together to ensure that the exercise was successful, and that there would be a smooth flow of events. An advertisement was made in a newspaper on 15th September, 2019 calling for opinions and memoranda on the Punguza Mizigo (Constitutional Amendment) Bill 2019 to be submitted to the Clerk of the County Assembly not later than 24th September, 2019. (*Annex 2*)

In addition to the notice in the newspaper, there were social media advertisements as follows;

- i. On the official "Facebook page" of the County Assembly
- ii. A link to the County Assembly website from where one could download a copy of the Bill
- iii. On the official "twitter account" of the Assembly
- iv. Messages sent to groups under the "WhatsApp" platform
- v. Emails to the accounts in the County Assembly database

Prior to the actual date of the exercise, the County Assembly had facilitated production of over 2,000 copies. The elected members were given fifty (50) advance copies of the Bill. All the Ward Managers had also been tasked with collection of twenty (20) copies of the Bills and copies of the advertisement and placing them at strategic points to ensure that highest number of people were informed. Other remaining copies were taken to the venues during the day of the Public Participation.

The venues had been secured through the Ward Liaison Office in consultation with area Members of County Assembly. These venues were secured as per the table below;

## 5. Runyenjes-Runyenjes Social Hall

#### 2.4 OTHER COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS

The Committee made the following observations based on the views and other general findings gathered from the Public.

#### 1. Venues

- i. That, the venues served the needs for public participation forums.
- ii. That, there were no cases of insecurity across the venues.
- iii. The highest group of the respondents were farmers.
- iv. The highest group of respondents were from the villages where the forums were held.

# 2. Involvement of the Committee on Public Participation in the planning of public forums

i. The Committee on Public Participation was fully involved in the planning and organization of the forums.

## 3. Adequacy of notice to the members of the public

- i. That, the complaint by the residents that the notice given was not adequate was a genuine concern. The notice in the advertisement was made on 15th September, 2019 while the event was slated for 18th September, 2019.
- 4. Adherence of the County Assembly to the Public Participation Act, 2015.

i. That, under the circumstances, the Committee noted that the County Assembly adhered to the provisions of the Embu County Public Participation Act, 2015.

## 5. Submission of written memoranda

i. That, no written memoranda was received.

#### 6. Attendance

- i. That, there was low turnout.
- ii. That, there was prevalent expectation of payment for attending the Public Participation forums.

#### 7. Distribution of copies

- i. That, fifty advance copies of the proposed bill were supplied to the Ward Managers of the various Wards, two days before the actual day of the Public Participation. However, some wards did not receive any copies.
- ii. That, other copies were distributed on the day of Public Participation forums.

#### 8. Timing

i. That, the time allocated for each Ward was insufficient to go through the entire document.

## 9. Persons with Disabilities (PWDs)

i. That, the exit survey questionnaire did not have a provision for Persons with Disabilities (PWDs).

#### 3.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

The committee made the following recommendations from the observations and findings;

- 1. That, the County Assembly should ensure that copies documents are availed at least seven (7) days prior to the date of Public forums to allow time for adequate interrogation by the members of the public. These documents can be circulated through the social media, County Assembly of Embu website and the stakeholder's individual emails as contained in the databank.
- 2. That, the County Assembly should ensure that adequate notice of at least seven (7) days prior to the public participation day is given to members of the public to enable the public prepare adequately.
- 3. That, the County Assembly should consider having a braille version of the Public documents for the blind and sign language interpreters for the deaf.
- 4. That, the County Assembly should ensure that publicity including placing advertisements in local radio stations for optimum circulation of information to the public. This will improve on attendance in the forums.
- 5. That, the County Assembly should ensure that for the documents that are bulky, a day is given for each venue so as to allow the public to give comprehensive contributions.

#### 4.0 CONCLUSION

The recommendations in this report were agreed upon by the Members of the Committee without any dissenting opinion and consequently appended their respective signatures to the report as a confirmation of the same. The committee urges the County Assembly to adopt this report with the recommendations therein.
